Budget 2021 focuses on infrastructure & Industry: FICCI

Chennai, Feb 2: The budget is special on various aspects ;the budget tried to cover most of the aspects giving importance to all the sectors. Interestingly, the Finance Minister started presenting it in a structured way referring to each and every head under which it is presented as "Pillar".

Commenting on the Union Budget 2021 - 22 presented today, M R Sivaraman, Former Revenue Secretary, Govt of India said "The budget

that was presented today by the Hon'ble Finance Minister would take at least six months to be implemented. Referring to the allocation of budget to States like Kerala, he opined that it would not be absorbed in full by the State owing to various bottlenecks. The absorbing capacity of a State with regards to the allocated budget is the most important aspect which would define whether the budget is a successful one or

not. Absorption of these is relatively easier in Tamilnadu due to rules and procedures in place coupled with officers who would ensure that. On the contrary, with the upcoming elections, States may not be willing to spend on the capital expenditure. After seeing the results of Human Development Index and Corruption Index, India has regressed in the past couple of years. Though the Finance Minister did not mention about the

outcome expected out of this budget, I do understand the difficulties that the Govt has been going through. Though the gross fiscal deficit is about 12%, good thing is inflation has not gone out of control. With regards to the GST, nothing much could be done since there were lot of things that were done with regards to this, already.

Dr G S K Velu, Chairman FICCI TNSC & CMD, Trivitrion Group of Companies said "I felt elated to see that the expenditure towards Healthcare sector has increased in this budget. This was one of the aspect which we wanted the Union Govt to five more consideration on and it was done"

Mohammed Afzal, Convenor FICCI Tamilnadu Tourism Panel & MD, Parveen Travels said "he woes of the tourism operators needs to be addressed as there are lot of restrictions with regards to operating the tour buses and the non-availability of drivers has made the situation worse".

P Sridharan, Head FICCI TNSC thanked all the delegates who took their time to come over and attend the meeting, making it a grand success.

Scrappage policy, a step in right direction: M&M

Mumbai, Feb 2: The announcement of the voluntary scrappage policy in the Union Budget is a step in "right direction", Mahindra & Mahindra Managing Director Pawan Goenka said on Monday while terming the Budget as the one with its whole thrust on "growth".

Talking to reporters at the post-Budget conference call, Goenka also called for setting aside the upcoming new regulations for the automobile industry in the next 12-18 months, as it was not ready to absorb any further increased cost.

"The scrappage policy is a step in the right direction. (However), what it does will depend on how aggressively the policy is (implemented) and whether the government is going to create incentives for scrapping," Goenka said.

Justifying the move not to make it mandatory even as that would help spur the demand, Goenka said that "to incentivise the scrap is the right thing but to force the vehicle owners to scrap is a wrong thing to do".

"Moreover, if you make it mandatory right now, you may not be able to

cope up with the demand that would generate because the number of old vehicles is large," he said.

A voluntary scrappage policy will allow a big chunk of these vehicles to be phased over a period of time, say five years, and then it can be made mandatory, he added.

The scrappage policy has to be done carefully so that it is not "misused" and the government should plug all the loopholes, he said adding that "we have waited long enough and can wait for another 1-2 month to get the policy right".

Growth-oriented budget: GJEPC

Chennai, Feb 2: Finance Minister's union budget is a bold and pragmatic growth-oriented budget, Colin Shah, Chairman, GJEPC said

The reduction in import duty from 12.5 per cent to 7.5 per cent will help the Gem & Jewellery exports become globally competitive.

Reduction in duty on raw materials would give the much-needed boost to the sector and help it to move to the next level. In fact, high duty on precious metal had made our exports uncompetitive leading to large Indian diaspora/NRI, moving to Dubai, Hong Kong or other centres to buy jewellery which

was largely impacting the employment as well as business in India. Along with this the decrease of import duty on jewellery findings to 10% will help the jewellery manufacturer exporters in a big way."

"Another relief for the industry was the clarification on Equalisation Levy. What we understand that from

the budget is that Online Equalisation Levy of 2% is now not applicable on B2B purchases from International Diamond Auctions. This will help our manufacturers of diamonds to buy directly from miners. Sincere thanks to Hon'ble FM for this relief," adds Colin Shah
